# Charles Chappell presided over the 1973 Annual Meeting in San Francisco, CA where LESI was formally created.



## CHARLES H. CHAPPELL \* 1973

Dr. Chappell, who headed up technology licensing for Union Carbide Corporation, was only getting started when, as a Charter Member of LES he became an organizer and energizer of LES U.S.A. He soon became active in creating a global organization of licensing profession-

als, LES International. And as President in 1973 he presided over the LES U.S.A. annual meeting at which LESI officially came into existence. Dr. Chappell died in 2002 at the age of 92. As shown in early chapters in this history, Chuck was instrumental in the successful formulation of LES.

#### MARCUS B. FINNEGAN \* 1974

A 1949 graduate of the U.S. Military Academy, Marc earned a law degree from the University of Virginia Law School and a Master of Laws at the George Washington University Law School in 1957. He was Senior Partner in the law firm of Finnegan, Henderson, Farabow & Garrett.

He became President of LESI in 1975 and was awarded the LES Gold Medal in 1977. He died in 1979 following a lengthy illness.



#### DUDLEY B. SMITH \* 1967

Dudley, a Charter Member of LES, was Licensing Coordinator for Celanese Corporation in New York City. He would be awarded the LES Gold Medal in 1971 and elected LES International President in 1978. He passed away in 2000.

- 87 articles by 138 unique authors covering SEP/FRAND issues, valuation techniques, AI, Blockchain, SMEs, COVID issues, various industry insights, trade secrets, copyrights, etc., etc.
- Special issue with EPO, special section for YMC, special issue for trade secrets, special section for LESI FRAND/SEP Study, special section for LESI Innovation Trends Task Force.



## LESI Global News June 2020 – May 2022

- January, April, July, and October publication schedule. Catch-all for current events. Digital only.
